5. Employability skills of students should also be given focus.



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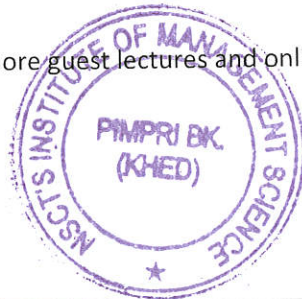

### Action Taken Report on Feedback (Students)

For the quality development & improvement in the syllabus and activities the Institute conducted feedback on the syllabus. On the basis of feedback suggested by the students on the syllabus the following action was taken and the same was presented & discussed in the IQAC meeting.

1. The teacher should use different teaching learning methods for the effective delivery of curricula to the students
2. To increase the availability of the reference books related to syllabus and encourage the students to use it during the academic year
3. The extra lectures/ remedial classes should be organized for the slow learners.
4. There could be routine interactive sessions between students and alumnae.
5. For extracurricular activities: The issue would be discussed with students, what all extra activities they intend to have apart from what were already organized.
6. A monthly evaluation e.g. class test, group discussion etc. should be conducted by concerned subject teachers for the analysis of attainments of PO'S CO'S and PSO'S.
7. Organizing more guest lectures and online events for students' engagement.



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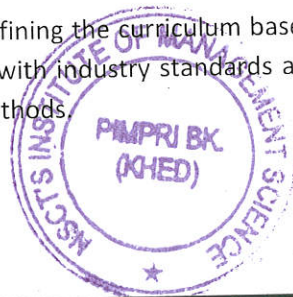

### Action Taken Report on Feedback (Alumni )

The feedback from alumni offers valuable insights into their experiences with the MBA program across various cohorts. Based on their responses, key areas have been identified, and corresponding actions are recommended for continuous improvement and the same was presented & discussed in the IQAC meeting.

1. Engage more alumni from older batches through targeted outreach and personalized communication to balance the representation and gather a more diverse range of experiences.
2. No immediate action is necessary, but this feedback can help guide future admission strategies and provide more tailored support to alumni based on their entrance pathways.
3. Develop partnerships with universities and professional organizations to offer alumni opportunities for advanced certifications, PhDs, or other programs. Consider hosting webinars and workshops on emerging educational trends and postgraduate options.
4. Maintain the current positive aspects of the syllabus while actively seeking more detailed feedback for targeted improvements. Engage alumni through surveys or focus groups to refine specific elements of the curriculum.
5. Organize career development workshops, resume building sessions, and mentorship programs that help alumni achieve faster career progression. Continue monitoring career advancement and provide alumni with networking opportunities and job placement support.
6. Continue refining the curriculum based on direct feedback. Ensure that course content remains up to date with industry standards and future trends. Encourage more interactive and applied learning methods.



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
